DETAILS:

Date: You will start your journey on Saturday, February 5, 2022 (Check-in available Friday, February 4 at 6pm)

Place: Camp Wokanda, 620 East Boy Scout Road, Chillicothe, IL

(Reserve a cabin or tent site by calling Wokanda at 309-579-2157.)

Cost: The registration fee for each scout and adult is \$16 if registration is received on or before Friday, January 22, 2022. After then the fee for each person will be \$20. Fee covers the event patch, hot lunch, souvenir, program supplies, awards and insurance.

In addition to Scout Spirit, each person must bring the following:

- Completed BSA Annual Health and Medical Record, Parts A & B (not more than one year old). Unit leaders will retain these records throughout the event.
- Completed Peoria Park District Liability Waiver, one form per unit listing all in attendance. These will be collected at check-in. (attached)

Parties will provide the following:

- Your wagon and cargo. (See information below.)
- Party identification flag. (See information below.)
- All meals, except Saturday lunch
- Entry into the Scoutmaster Dutch Oven Dessert Competition, served at lunch. (See information below.)

Host will provide the following for lunch:

- Hearty pioneer meal with all needed utensils
- Souvenir cup with 1 packet hot chocolate
- Unlimited coffee for adults

Awards!

- Top two scoring parties at each station will be recognized.
- Top three overall parties will be recognized based on a kernel count after the last station. Do not lose your kernels !
- First party to stake their claim in the land rush will be recognized.

TRAIL CHALLENGES:

The Lewis & Clark Expedition ~

This 8000 mile journey that took over 2 years to complete was deemed a huge success, providing geographic, ecological and social information about uncharted areas of North America. Will you also be successful in making such discoveries?

Donner Party Pancakes ~

An early winter has arrived in the Sierra Nevada mountains, leaving you stranded less than 30 miles from the nearest IHOP. Those who have survived the journey so far are quite hungry. Is your camp cook ready to whip up and flip some flapjacks to your wagon master?

Jean Nicolas-Perlot's Gravelly Findings ~

Gold brought this Belgian around Cape Horn to California, but gold he did not first find. Tragedy littered the trail. After burying the dead a proper grave marker is needed. Can you fashion one, or several?

Daniel Boone's Great Pathfinding Adventure ~

"I can't say as ever I was lost, but I was bewildered once for three days"..
Try out your skills on the Cumberland Gap Orienteering Course. Can you track the bear, as the Great Pathfinder once did?

Buffalo Bill's Pony Express Ride ~

Before he became the legendary Wild West Showman, a young 14 year old William 'Buffalo Bill' Cody claims to have served as a Pony Express rider. Can your party, around the same age today, deliver important messages on time?

Jedediah Smith's Recovery Shelter ~

Fur trapping in the Western Wilderness is dangerous work. When a member of your party is attacked by a grizzly a quick canvas shelter must be erected for rest and recovery. Do you have the problem-solving skills to get the job done?

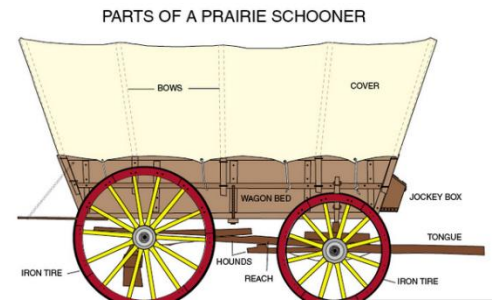
Davy Crockett and the Alamo Massacre ~

PREPARING FOR THE JOURNEY:

Wagon

Will your party bring a Conestoga or a Prairie Schooner? You decide which is needed for a successful journey, and what fittings are needed based on the weather conditions to transport your precious cargo – no special rules here! Bring it with you to check-in however. Bonus kernels will be added to your pouch for those with a wagon fitting of our theme.



Cargo

- One 6 foot hiking stick for each member of your party
- Several long lengths of lashing rope
- Blanket or tarp
- Natural tinder, kindling and fuel
- Flint and steel
- Campstove fire starter
- Pancake skillet
- Pancake spatula
- Plate
- Compass
- Tent stakes
- First Aid equipment
- Water bottle for each member of your party
- Journal and pencil
- Scoutbook, protected from weather



Party Identification flag

Every party on the trail needs an identification flag, so fellow travelers know who you are. This will also be needed for the Wokanda Territory Land Rush. Without your flag you won't be able to stake your claim! Your party should also have a 'yell', in case we encounter a blizzard and need to call for you.

Scoutmaster Dutch Oven Dessert Competition

Rule 1: Only Scout Leaders 18 or over are allowed to enter the competition. Troops may have multiple entries.

Rule 2: Desserts must be cooked on site and brought to the Dining Hall by 11:40am.
