Meals

Saturday breakfast, lunch and dinner and Sunday breakfast will be provided to all participants.

Camping

We will be utilizing the group camping method. Cub Scout Packs will have one designated area and Scouts BSA Troops will have a separate area. Scouts BSA Girl Troops and Boy Troops will have their own designated areas but Troops that are linked can be placed in proximity if desired.

Equipment

Minimal equipment is needed. Troops/Packs should plan on their own tents and personal gear but since meals are being provided, there is no need for dining flies, etc. to be brought.

Fires

There will be a group campfire on Saturday evening as part of the program. For Friday night, ISR fire pits will be used. Units should not plan on bringing their own firepits.
